

Nappy clutch – Just pop in your handbag and you are ready to go.



Needs

Cut

- Two oblong pieces of fabric works well with different colours /patterns 27 x 37 cms
- Two oblong pieces for the pouch's different fabric again (use up scraps use different on each pouch) 14 x 27 cms
- Two more different strips of fabric for binding (same or different) 27 x 6.3 cm
- Length of elastic approx. 8cms
- One largish button to fasten

Method – these clutches are simple and quick BUT, follow in the order listed to get the result

1. Iron binding strips in half then iron edges under
2. Sew the binding across the top of each pouch pocket
3. Choose the fabric for the inside of the pouch, pin the pouch on top of each right side up (both) Pin at each end of the oblong. (This has both right sides facing upwards)
4. Pin the other oblong right side facing inwards towards the side with the pouches pinned along the top
5. Pin round three sides, on the top shorter edge (the end)
6. Pin the elastic (inwards) into place to form a loop on the inside, between the outer edge and the pouch)
7. Sew around the three edges trim the seams and turn inside out and iron flat
8. Along the top open edge iron, the edge in 2cm
9. Top stitch close to the edge closing the other edge
10. Sew on the button on the outer edge 4 cm from the edge to loop the elastic over.

The pouch will hold 3-4 disposable nappies, small wipes pack and, (If you want a paper change mat).
